"ATƏT-ə sədrlik edən Finlandiya tərəfindən Helsinki Yekun Aktının 50-ci ildönümünə həsr olunmuş "Helsinki+50" konfransı bir daha təsdiq edib ki, ATƏT-in prinsipləri qüvvədə qalır və ATƏT regionunda təhlükəsizlik və sabitliyin əsası olmalıdır".



The common principles must continue to serve as a fundamental feature of our collective work, fostering inclusivity and a sense of shared ownership among all participating States, especially at a time of increased divisions and competition. The OSCE's tools and mechanisms are co-operative in nature and were developed within the context of the emergence of comprehensive and co-operative security. Only cooperative solutions can yield positive results, while opening black-box thinking will only deepen mistrust and fragmentation.

The ability of the OSCE to be prepared to deal with the risks and challenges to our security and stability will depend on whether the Organization is agile enough to take lessons from past failures, analyze their causes and adapt to the rapidly evolving environment to remain relevant and to deliver.

In this context, of particular necessity is the closure of the OSCE structures related to the former Soviet process that became irrelevant with the end of the conflict that once called for their establishment.

Increasing efficiency, transparency and accountability within the organization, including in the budget process, will be key in finding solutions to the current challenges and preparing for the future ones. Organization's scarce resources must be utilized where they are needed the most.

Engaged and shared driven practical cooperation within the OSCE, including in tackling transnational threats and other non-military security challenges needs to be priority. Addressing other cross-dimensional challenges will require ensuring an appropriate balance across all three dimensions, free from undue political considerations. Respect for human rights and fundamental freedoms must be scaffolded on an equal and non-discriminatory basis.

The Economic and Environmental Dimension is an important pillar of the OSCE's comprehensive concept of security has untapped potential and has to be further explored and developed. This will contribute to overall security and stability of the OSCE region.
